





Alfred Salter uses the Sport Premium funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport we offer. All spending of the Sport Premium will therefore support Alfred Salter in achieving one of the following indicators:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that we already offer;
- build capacity and capability within our school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years;
- support the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity;
- elevate the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement;
- increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of all our staff in teaching PE and sport;
- allow all of our pupils to experience a broader range of sports and activities;
- increase participation in competitive sport.

This year, Alfred Salter Primary School was allocated £22,142.

They make informed choices about healthy eating, fitness and their emotional wellbeing</p>	<p>Staff completed a PE subject knowledge audit to measure their knowledge, skills, understanding and confidence in planning and delivering PE lessons. Staff who were identified as needing further support were then selected to receive the relevant CPD.</p> <p>One-to-one support staff took part in an 8-week intervention to improve PE provision for SEND pupils. Over the 8-week period, LPESSN specialists worked alongside support staff to provide SEND pupils with an additional weekly PE session. This provision then continued beyond the 8-week support period, with support staff taking ownership of the intervention's delivery.</p> <p>In a Pupil Voice Survey, 76% of pupils agreed or strongly agreed that they really enjoyed nearly all of their PE lessons.</p>  <p>Staff have improved knowledge and understanding of high quality teaching, learning and delivery of activities. This has increased capacity and sustainability. Enhanced quality of teaching, learning, delivery and assessment of PE leads to improved standards with greater and more rapid progress.</p>

We did however hold a 'Virtual Sports Day', where children took part in a range of fun fitness challenges.</p> <p>Our contract with TeachSport allows us to deliver a broad range of inclusive lunchtime activity to our pupils. Our specialist playmaker organises, delivers and officiates a programme of lunchtime sporting provision activity, timetabling activity based on year group to ensure that children of all abilities have equal opportunities to get involved and so that activity is not dominated by the older year groups.</p>

Consequently, they are challenged further in terms of ability, technique and competitive tactics. Children feel pride in representing a school team.</p> <p>Fixtures are all recorded via the competition calendar. As well as developing the love of physical activity and knowledge of health and well-being in our children, these extra swimming lessons also look to achieve the target of all children being able to swim fifty metres unaided by the end of KS2.</p>
