

The government is providing £150 million per annum for the academic years of 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 to provide new funding for primary school sport. The funding is jointly provided by the Department of Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport. Money is paid directly to schools, for schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. Each school receives a basic grant plus an additional £5 per pupil each year. This means at Alfred Salter we receive around £17384 a year. Schools must spend the sports premium funding on improving their provision for PE and sport, whilst having the freedom to decide how they do this.

At Alfred salter we are strongly committed to PE. This is evident by the wide range of activities in and out of school that we offer, including involvement in competitive sports. We recognise the importance of PE to the health and wellbeing of our pupils and the impact of the PE curriculum and extracurricular activities can have on the attitude confidence and academic achievement of all pupils.
